Easy Sugar Cookies

Ingredients:

- 2 3/4 Cups all purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 cup butter, softened
- 1 1/2 cups white sugar
- 1 egg
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

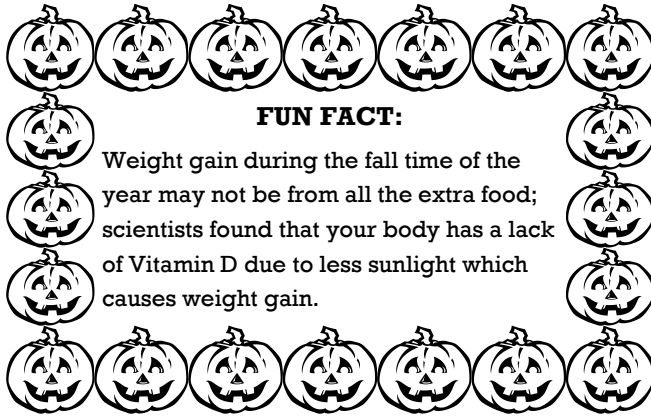
Directions:

Preheat oven to 375 Degrees F
In small bowl combine dry ingredients.

In a large bowl, cream together butter & sugar. Beat in egg and vanilla. Slowly, blend in dry ingredients. Roll dough into balls and place onto ungreased cookie sheets.

Bake 8 to 10 minutes or until golden brown.

Decorate as desired.
